- 5. President Meyerhoeffer mentioned the following honors and commendations:
- a. A letter was received from a teacher of the sixth grade in American Falls commending the museum and thanking us for the opportunity for her grade to visit.
- b. Region X of the Department of Education selected our Adult Basic Education Program as one of the two top programs in the region.
- c. A commendation was received from Wil Overgaard for both Marcie Donner and Bruce Bennett in their work with ACTION programs.
- d. Jerry Beck was given a charge to do some cultural things during the summer with the continuing education program. They have done an exceptional job and have planned, for this summer, a dance program which will be directed by Beverly Hackney, a music festival by Margaret Vincent, Kollege for Kids, Teen College, and other activities. This is an additional to the regular continuing education program. They are also conducting a number of computer camps during the summer.
- 6. John Rosholt is pursuing the geothermal water adjudication issue. There will be a hearing on the 29th of May at 1 p.m. in the city council chambers.
