- ... explain degree requirements.
- ... locate important deadlines and dates.

At or Before 15 credits

Phase 2:

As a result of students participating in the dual credit academic advising process, they will be able to:

- ... explain FERPA and how it applies to them.
- ... define common college terms (registration, catalog, etc.).
- ... locate where to find important deadlines and dates.
- ... utilize college technologies including Student Information Systems, Online classroom technology (i.e. Blackboard), and college email.
- ... compare the various types of degrees (AA, AS, AAS, BS, BA).
- ... explore majors and career paths.
- ... identify barriers to success and resources or strategies to overcome them.
- ... describe general education requirements and how they fit into a degree plan.
- ... explain degree requirements.
- ... summarize how courses transfer between institutions.
- ... identify graduation requirements (if applicable).
